THE FCA STORY

The Fernald Community Alliance (FCA) grew out of the Fernald Living History Project, which started in 1997 as an effort to record and preserve all aspects of Fernald's Cold War history, including land acquisition, construction, uranium production, worker contributions, environmental contamination, citizen involvement, health effect studies, cleanup, and restoration. A large part of this effort was conducting over 130 video interviews with former workers, citizens, government officials, and regulators, who were involved with the many aspects of Fernald. Transcripts of these interviews are available online at the FCA Web page.

When the Fernald cleanup was completed in 2006, the Living History Project evolved into the FCA—a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization. Today the FCA works on historical, ecological, and educational projects that have helped the Fernald Preserve become the valuable community asset it is now. The FCA is working with the U.S. DOE Office of Legacy Management to tell the story of Fernald, develop a center of education at the site, and highlight the lessons learned from the sites various missions for current and future generations.




